



Dear Voter,

Ohio has long been a national leader in making it easy to vote and hard to cheat. For more than 20 years, voters have had three great choices in how and when they cast a ballot. If you choose not to vote in person, state law allows you to vote securely by mail.

The next election is coming up on Tuesday, November 3, 2026. If you're registered to vote and prefer to vote by mail, please complete the absentee ballot request form on the back of this letter. Be sure to provide all the required information including your phone number and/or email address in case any follow-up is required. **Also, don't forget to sign it!**

To account for possible postal delays, **we recommend that you return the absentee ballot application to your county board of elections as soon as possible. The deadline to request an absentee ballot is October 27, 2026.** You can track the secure processing of your request and ballot at VoteOhio.gov/Track.

Remember, if you don't wish to vote by mail, you can still vote in person. Early voting is available at your county board of elections beginning on October 6, 2026, and Election Day is Tuesday, November 3, 2026. If you do choose to vote in person, be sure to bring a current government-issued photo ID. Information on acceptable forms of identification can be found at VoteOhio.gov.
